## BRUSSELS-LUX STUDY TOUR

The Center for European Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison is pleased to announce a call for applications for the Brussels-Lux Study Tour 2023. The study tour--organized by the European Studies Center at the University of Pittsburgh and the Center for European Studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill--will take place June 18<sup>th</sup> to June 24<sup>th</sup>. The Center for European Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison will provide a travel grant to support the participation of one Wisconsin educator for this five-day long tour. It is open to pre-service teachers, K-12 educators, and faculty from community colleges and Title III-/Title V-eligible institutions across the nation, in any discipline.

Because the study tour is organized in partnership with several universities across the United States, educators will have the opportunity to experience Europe with peers from around the country. During the tour, participants will engage in a variety of site visits to learn more about the European Union – how it is organized, what it does, and how non-EU institutions work with the EU. Past trips have included visits to European Union institutions (the European Parliament, the European Commission), NATO, the US Mission and think tank/consulting institutions.
